

1779 - 1783 Fort George - Protected by the Crown

Explore the Revolutionary War from the perspective of the British, Loyalists, and even the German “Hessian” military with a couple events related to Fort George in Castine, Maine.

On the September 9 & 10, the public is invited to participate in events at Fort George. Registered teachers will fill out a pre-event questionnaire related to the British and “Hessian” and Loyalist side of the American Revolution specifically related to Maine. They will sign in at the different stations/programs on the day(s) of attendance. A post-event questionnaire will test increased knowledge. Registered teachers will also receive educational materials for a classroom unit on the American Revolution and have the option of receiving contact hours.
